KWHLU

The KWL strategy is a very common graphic organizer used in content area instruction. With KWL, students brainstorm what they <u>know</u> about a topic, what they <u>want</u> to learn, and when they have <u>learned</u> after the unit of study.

K	W	L

To make this graphic organizer more powerful, consider **the KWHLU strategy**. K is for what you already <u>know</u>, W for what you <u>want</u> to know, H for <u>how</u> you want to learn it, L for what you have <u>learned</u>, and U for how you will <u>use</u> it in your world.

K	W	Н	L	U

The KWHLU strategy will not only help students attend better, it will help them comprehend, allow them to have some choice in how they best learn, and encourage them to consider using their new learning outside of the classroom.
